

ICAR-NIVEDI Commemorates 25 Years of Leadership in Veterinary Epidemiology, Disease Informatics and One-Health

Bengaluru, 1st July 2025: The ICAR-National Institute of Veterinary Epidemiology and Disease Informatics (ICAR-NIVEDI), Bengaluru, celebrated its 25th Foundation Day today at its campus, marking a significant milestone in its contributions to veterinary research, disease informatics, and One Health. The event was attended by all scientists, staff members, and retired staff of the institute.

The programme commenced with a flag hoisting ceremony and continued as per the scheduled events. Dr. P.P. Sengupta delivered the welcome address, highlighting the institute's journey since its inception as the Project Directorate on Animal Disease Monitoring and Surveillance (PD-ADMAS) in 2000, and its evolution into a premier centre for veterinary epidemiology and informatics.
